GROUP PROJECT "FREELOADER" STATEMENT

Every student working in a group should pull his or her own weight. "Freeloaders" who just put their name in a group hoping to get a good grade while others do the work will be dropped from the group and receive a ZERO by consensus of the remaining group members.

<u>How are "Freeloaders" identified?</u> Here are some common examples that will qualify you as a "Freeloader" and put you in danger of a ZERO:

- Hard to contact; Not replying to emails or phone calls from the group. Group members should document when they initiate contacts with other group members.
- Not initiating contacts themselves, but leaving it up to the group to contact them and then playing the "nobody contacted me" game when the assignment is due. Similarly, engaging in so called "last minute contacting frenzies", such as NO contact initiation all semester long, but then frantically sending out multiple contacts just before the deadline, claiming that this somehow qualifies as really having "tried" to contact the group.
- Not following through with assigned or selected tasks. This is especially cumbersome when done last minute
 close to the deadline. To help mitigate this behavior, groups should set internal deadlines and keep all group
 members accountable for completion of tasks.
- Turning in very shoddy or plagiarized work, the so called "last minute internet copiers". Cutting it close to deadlines, turning in something blatantly copied from the internet as "their" contribution. Not only does this behavior constitute academic fraud, group members should report such behavior immediately to the instructor.

YOU HAVE BEEN WARNED!

Note: Do not wait too long for a group member to "come through. Document any sign of "Freeloading" by a group member and contact the instructor early. Waiting too long neither serves you nor the "Freeloader" and jeopardizes everyone's grade.

Printed work MUST BE ELECTRONICALLY PRODUCED! This includes chemical formulas, equations, tables and special characters. Become intimately familiar with these functions in your preferred word processor. Be familiar with placing and sizing visuals into a written document.

Electronic Presentations (PPT, video) should be of sufficient quality and resolution that graphics, pictures and video clips are crisp, clear and easy to understand.

TRI-FOLD BROCHURE: There are some free templates for tri-fold brochures available from MS Office. These have a proven graphic design layout: fonts, layouts and color schemes. You may use those and enhance them with your own graphic inserts and writing!

POSTER: Again, there are many advertising poster templates available from third party vendors or Microsoft. Some of these are free and you may use them. Our geology students use PowerPoint to create scientific posters for conference presentations. It is best to export the finished product as a pdf which our plotters can print easily. Make sure your graphics are at least 300dpi or they will look pixely. Be especially careful when downloading pictures from the web. These may look great on your screen (usually 75 to 96pdi), but will look awful when printed.

VIDEO: Creating videos has never been easier and you may use your cell phone to do so. Your smart phone and/or computer may already have FREE video editing software (In Win10 it hides in the photo viewer). Mac users will have an edge here. There are also a bunch of free software solutions available. Individual scenes should be at least 5 seconds long or your video will start being choppy. A 5 to 10 second minimum time per clip is a good rule of thumb. Make sure sound is clear when interviewing people. When showing pictures be mindful of the resolution especially when zooming. Your credits should scroll at the end of your video.



MUST BE ELECTRONICALLY PREPARED! This includes chemical formulas, equations, tables and special characters. Become intimately familiar with these functions in your preferred software. When using graphics be sure these have captions, reproduce well, and are of high quality. Be familiar with placing and sizing visuals into your software platform.

GRADING

In general, for each fault in layout, grammar, spelling, content, concept, format, presentation, expression, design, citation, missing content, etc. I will deduct points. Multiple points can be deducted for larger infractions, such as missing or obscure content. Be aware that repeat mistakes will count MORE THAN ONCE!

RUBRIC:

- /10 GROUP MEMBER PARTICIPATION one or multiple point deduction per infraction Evidence of each group member's involvement in the project: shows in writing by submitted contribution sheet / job summary; evidenced in presentation material.
- /20 LAYOUT, COMPILATION, MECHANICS one point deduction per infraction Pleasing to eye (margins, paragraphs, easy to read font); creative; obviously practiced and/or reviewed
- VISUALS one or multiple point deduction per infraction
 Balanced (do not take over text); clearly reproduced; Map; Quality of Graphics; min 300dpi;
- /20 CONTENT one or multiple point deduction per infraction Evidenced based; unusual facts; interesting Colorado geology places; evidence of own research; evidence of interviews;
- /20 PRESENTATION one or multiple point deduction per infraction
 Creative; convincing; positive / professional writing / presentation style; honest marketing (no hype);
 understanding of Colorado's geologic attractions and highlights evident; holds attention of reader / viewer
- 10 CITATIONS (2 pts ea) one or multiple point deduction per infraction You must use a minimum of 5 properly formatted APA style citations

THE FINAL PRODUCT

The final product has a title page mentioning the title of the assignment, ALL group members the course and the date.

The **completed** GROUP MEMBER PAGE found on page 1 of the assignment outline must be inserted into the assignment or uploaded separately, especially when submitting YouTube videos where privacy might be an issue.

The group leader will submit the completed project by the DEADLINE or before through CANVAS!!! (*Test your generated PDF to see if formatting and pictures exported correctly before submittal*). Everyone in the group will receive the same grade, which includes any late penalties.
